Do you qualify for up to £500 worth of home insulation?

If you are on certain benefits, **you could be eligible for a Warm Deal Grant of up to £500.** In most cases this will be enough to cover everything you need to insulate your home. - Attendance Allowance.
- Council Tax Benefit.
- Child Tax Credit (with a household income of less than £15,050).
- Disability Living Allowance.
- Disabled Persons Tax Credit.
- Housing Benefit.
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance.
- Income Support.
- Industrial Injuries Disablement Benefit (which must include a Constant Attendance Allowance).
- War Disablement Pension (which must include the mobility supplement or Constant Attendance Allowance).
- Working Tax Credit (with a household income of less than £15,050).
- Pension Credit.

Remember - people who are not on benefits, but aged 60 or over, may be entitled to a grant of up to £125 towards the cost of insulating their home.
